Who will be there and what will the room look like?

What can you do if you need help?

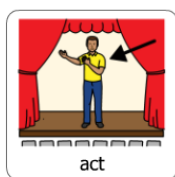
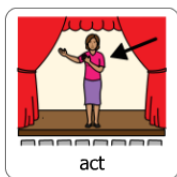
If you need help on the day or are worried about anything, you can speak to any of our teachers and ask for help. We want you to have a fun day, so if you are worried about anything we will help you!

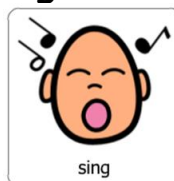

We encourage pupils to bring ear defenders if they struggle with noise, and any fidget toys that they want to bring with them. There will be props to use on the day but they are optional. They need to wear clothes that are easy to move in, and trainers or other comfortable shoes. Please bring a coat as they will be allowed to go outside if the weather is nice.

The site is fully secured once the gate is closed after pupils have been dropped off. If pupils need some time away from the main group, a staff member can take them for a walk outside or into a quiet room for a break.

Please do not drop off your child earlier than 9.45am as the space will not be set up. We can register them from 9.45am-10am for a 10am start. There will be a short performance at 3.30pm for friends and family. We ask that you do not take photos or videos of anyone else's children. The performance will be filmed and sent to you once anyone without photo permission has been edited out.

After the event you will receive a link to a feedback form with a section for you to complete and one for the pupil to complete with your help.
